POST-SECONDARY ENROLLMENT OPTIONS

This policy establishes the requirements for student enrollment in post-secondary courses taken before high school graduation.

ELIGIBLE INSTITUTIONS

Students may take courses at eligible post-secondary institutions within Maine, which include but not limited to the University of Maine System and Maine Maritime Academy.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

A student may take unlimited courses per academic year. A student must meet the following criteria prior to enrolling in a post-secondary course:

- A. Have a minimum of a B average [or 3.0] in the student's courses overall; freshmen and sophomores will need a letter of reference from the building administrator.
- B. Meet the course admission standard of the eligible institution;
- C. Provide evidence of parent/guardian approval for taking the course; and
- D. Obtain approval from the Principal and Guidance Counselor.
- E. Freshmen and Sophomores:
 - 1. Would not earn high school credit.
 - 2. Time for this class would not be given during school hours.
 - 3. Would have a regular core class schedule.

A student enrolled in grade 11 or 12 who does not have a B average or 3.0 in their courses overall is eligible to take a post-secondary course provided that the student:

A. Has been assessed and received a recommendation to take the course from the school administration and has been approved for participation in the course by an eligible institution.

AWARDING OF CREDITS

The eligible institution shall grant full credit to any student who successfully completes a course.

High school graduation credit for a course taken under this policy shall be awarded as follows:

- A. The course must meet for a minimum of one semester. If shorter than a semester then weight accordingly.
- B. The course must meet any applicable Learning Results standards.
- C. The student must earn a passing grade of at least a C in the course.
- D. Attendance must satisfy the instructor's requirements.

The school shall not be responsible for payment.

SCHOOL UNIT REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

The Superintendent shall make parents and students aware of post-secondary enrollment options through handbooks or other appropriate means.
